Background

- As part of the self-guided preparation for the Ministry of the Attorney General (ministry)
 court interpreting test (CIT), the Court Interpretation Unit invites freelance court
 interpreter candidates to observe court before taking the CIT.
- Candidates are <u>not required</u> to observe court matters before taking the CIT; however, many express an interest in doing so.
- The options included in this document provide opportunities to observe in-person and/or virtual Ontario court matters where court interpretation services may be delivered.
- Whether or not court interpretation services are actively being delivered, court
 observation gives prospective interpreters an opportunity to better acquaint themselves
 with Ontario court procedures, terminology, and roles.

<u>Guidance on courtroom decorum</u> – PLEASE READ BEFORE PROCEEDING

- If asked, identify yourself honestly with your full name and why you are attending court (e.g., prospective court interpreter attending for your learning).
- Do not take notes, photos, or recordings.
- Dress in alignment with the dignity of the court (e.g., business or business casual attire, no profanity, avoid logos and political symbols).
- If attending a courtroom in person:
 - you may be required to go through point-of-entry security screening conducted by local police and/or check in with court staff (e.g., interpreter coordinator). You may be asked for government-issued photo identification (Driver's License, etc.).
 - bow upon entering the courtroom.
 - quietly sit and observe.
- For Zoom courtrooms in particular,
 - o be mindful of what appears on camera (e.g., words, images, other people).
 - name yourself with your full name and "(Observer)," unless otherwise directed by the local court staff or presiding judicial official.
 - you may be asked to keep your camera on or turn it off.
 - o keep your microphone muted unless you are asked to speak.

Options for court observation

Note: For options 2 and 3, it is not guaranteed that court staff will be able to fulfill every request and they may need time to respond. Please allow time for a response before following up.

To help you plan for any of the options, you may want to consult the upcoming Ontario Court of Justice (OCJ) matters listed on the Daily Court Lists (ontariocourtdates.ca) website.

- 2) In-person visit any Ontario Court of Justice courthouse and let security and/or court staff know that you are interested in becoming a ministry-accredited court interpreter and want to observe a matter that is open to the public. You should be directed to the local court interpretation coordination staff or to an appropriate courtroom.
