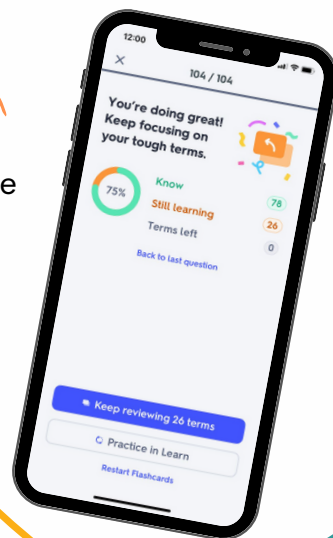

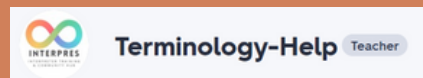
Click on a deck you wish to open.

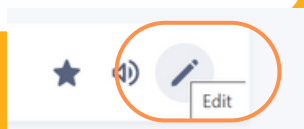
Then, click on '**Folders**' and

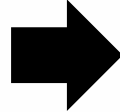
You can track your progress

When you are on 'Flashcard' mode, you can go to 'Options' and activate '**Card sorting**' to keep track of the terms and equivalents you have memorized or not yet. This can help you stay focused on the ones you need to study most.

Options

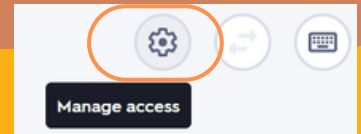
Card sorting

Sort your cards to focus on the terms which need further review. Turn sorting off if you want to review your flashcards quickly.



Keep your sets **Private** or **Public**

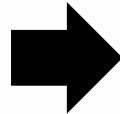
When you create a new Study Set you can keep it private or make it public. When a set is public, other people can access its contents but they can only make changes if they make a copy of their own.



Sound out the Terms

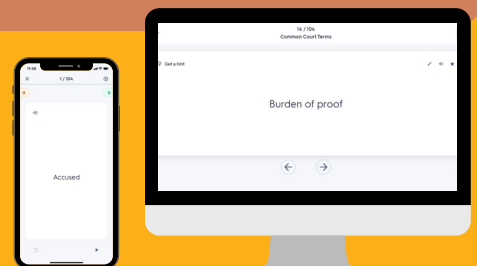
You can benefit greatly from listening to the terms and definitions. Try activating the various features that will allow you to sharpen your listening skills while you work on terminology memorization.
